

Am I in a dangerous working situation?

When someone tricks, hurts, or forces a child under the age of 18 to work for them without treating them fairly or paying them enough, **this is child labor trafficking**. It can be in jobs like cleaning houses or working in farms, as well as begging and selling drugs. It's important to remember that **this is wrong** and that **YOU have the right to get help**.

You may be in a trafficking situation if:



You are unsure **when and how you are paid**



You **live in the same place** where you work



You are **not allowed to connect** with family



Your family in your home country is **threatened**



You are **not allowed to go to school**



You are the only one **taking care of younger children**



You are **expected to serve others** even when you do not want to



Someone is promising they will **pay off your debt** if you work for them



Someone **takes your important documents** like your passport or ID



You are **financially responsible for your family**



You and others were **hurt while working** and not allowed to see a doctor



You are being threatened with being **turned into immigration** or being deported
