CARRE extends its deep and sincere gratitude to our Community Advisory Board (CAB). Simply put, CARRE would not have achieved its depth, reach and resonance without every person who gave their time and experience to shape the work and provide critical feedback.

Addressing and mitigating the impacts of childhood trauma for those most in need starts with trust- trust built through meaningful, collaborative community connection. CARRE's CAB plays an essential role in advising our programming, resources and services, ensuring they remain responsive to the needs and realities of communities impacted by crisis and conflict. The invaluable perspectives, feedback and direction allow CARRE to scale its impact, meeting families in the moment with integrity, thoughtfulness and accuracy.

Since inception, 27 unique individuals have served on the CARRE CAB. CARRE is proud to share that throughout its five years, CAB members came from more than 17 states allowing us to benefit from perspectives from all over the U.S. CAB members brought incredible technical expertise to their feedback and guidance. More than 85% of members have direct and substantial experience working with forcibly displaced populations, close to half have expertise in early childhood and adolescent trauma, and almost one third have personal experience with forced displacement. We are deeply grateful for the depth of expertise and experience this group has brought to the CAB over the last five years.
